I rather enjoyed this weekend's match. As one of two GHC 7-a-side teams playing both Teddington and Horsham Hockey Clubs, GHC Team 1 looked up for a challenge as they faced up to Horsham Team 1.

Early in the game, it was clear that GHC 1 were well matched with Horsham 1. Both teams worked the ball well up the pitch and put themselves in goal scoring positions. Another tight game, Guildford showed some real commitment notably from Sean. This one ended in another draw, final score 1-1, with Jake scoring the only goal.


