



Saturday 18th February

Guildford 4 – 3 Bournville Marsh D x2, Boot, Baggs

Finally, our first league game of 2012! The snow and freezing conditions of the last few weeks had really hampered our preparations for this part of the season with numerous games and training sessions cancelled. However, other teams must have had similar problems so we were keen to start this game with a bang.

This was achieved and our aggression and high press created space and chances in the opening ten minutes. Snowy was able to break down the by-line and chip over the keeper to find Duncan Marsh at the far post who volleyed it home for the first. Unfortunately, hockey matches last for 70 minutes and we were guilty of backing off and lost a lot of the aggression that got us three goals up. This allowed Bournville to find some space and get some time on the ball. Despite this, it was still 3-0 at half time and we knew the next goal would be crucial.

We lacked the same snap that we started the match with and Bournville were able to get a goal back shortly after the interval. This opened the flood gates and the home side became a shambles. Possession was given away, silly green cards were collected by those who should know better and Bournville scored two more and were level with 15 minutes to go and to be fair, they were on top.

One thing we are good at at Guildford is digging in and not giving up. This meant that when Duncan Marsh scored his second to put us into the lead we were able to hold on to the 3 points by the skin of our teeth and largely thanks to some good goal keeping from Hamish Hall, playing only his second national league game. Bournville felt hard done by but thanks to our great start to the game, we sneaked it.

So, we got away with it and we now need to move on and put in some much better performances next week as we play Birmingham University on Saturday and Cheltenham on Sunday (both at home). A literal six pointer!

Indian Gymkhana 3's 2 – 5 Guildford 3's

The 3's took their tally in recent games to 6 points from a possible 9 with an assured win over Indian Gymkhana. The game also saw the appearance of returning "hall of fame" star, Liam Buxton.

Indian Gym were a typically skillful bunch and looked dangerous going forward, but after a trade mark pre-match brief from 3's tactician, JB, Guildford looked organised in the initial phases of the game. With both sides looking likely, it was the 3's who took the early lead after 10 minutes when Chris Botma took advantage of a swift Guildford attack to tuck the ball home from close range.

After the goal however, gaps appeared in the Guildford midfield and Indian Gym bagan exploiting the space, looking ever more dangerous on the attack. The home side levelled the tie midway through the first half after some lax marking at the back. Keeper Valner, did well to save the first effort, but the ball rebounded kindly for the Indian Gym forward who was left with the simplest of finishes.

With the game in the balance, Guildford continued to apply pressure, but Indian Gym looked dangerous on the counter. JB gave Guidlford the lead before the break, but no-one quite remembers how. All we know is that at half time, the 3's had the narrowest of leads at 2-1. The game was anyone's.

In the second half, Indian Gym came out with renewed vigour and threatened an equaliser. Stout Guildford back 5 of Valner, Gibson, Hansen and Bungle led by skipper, Rhino, kept the score at 2-1 for more than ten minutes. However, after sustained pressure from Indian Gym, they won yet another dubious short corner, which managed to squirm its way between the shut legs of Andy and led to the equaliser.

What followed was a frenetic period of ten minutes in which Guildford effectively put the game to bed. Firstly, when the ball was slipped left at a short corner, a botched shot from Sanderson was turned home by JB. Then another deflected short corner led to the 4th, the call was slip left again, but having looked up to see that the opposition were in no rush to close him down Rhino blasted it at the back post where Nate 'Dawg' Farrant was there with the most composed of finishes. JB completed his hat-trick and sealed Indian Gym's fate moments later after some great counter attacking play from Nick Hyett, finding JB in the D who then showed great composure to round the keeper and fire home.

With the game all but sown up, 3's midfielder, Sanderson, soured the proceedings after a moment of petulance and was shown a yellow card. His protests that the "5 yard rule" was an unclear one fell on deaf ears. There was even time for Guildford to allow the returning Buxton a couple of short corners and a shot at the glory, however he topped both efforts horribly and the score stayed at 2-5.

JB, the hat trick hero was named man of the match, but a mention should go out to every member of the squad for a quality team performance. The 3's now look to leap up the table with their next game, at home, to King Alleyns.
