Last year Maria and Marcus made that jump from Junior hockey to adult hockey. Next year, it is hoped that Bella, Matt and Henry can follow in their footsteps as GHC looks to development sides in both Men's and Ladies hockey to help Juniors manage the transition in their hockey.

At the end of the season, all the GKs who regularly attended training have shown some significant improvement.

His overall skills have come on significantly over the last year and his performance in Barcelona before Christmas was outstanding. Guildford 3s 3-1 Reading 2As

After sitting pretty in 3rd position at the half way stage of the season, the combination of circumstances that had conspired to leave the 3s fighting to avoid their 7th consecutive defeat at the end of the season had baffled everyone. Playing a strong Reading side we had been fortunate to draw against earlier in the season was no-one's idea of the ideal game to stop the rot, but luckily Reading travelled with a bare 11 and a mixed bag of wide-ranging hockey ability. Guildford welcomed back Vidal Sassoon from his traitorous University-based activities and Mullet from his invented ankle 'injury' and had a strong match day squad of 14.

The home side played as well as we have in recent weeks in the first half, with a new 4-3-3 formation meaning we played the majority of the game further up the pitch, and with lots of energy and running injected into the side from returning players. This we did surprisingly well, starving their dangerous centre-forward of the ball and frustrating their holding midfield player into the most selfish and ineffective hockey performance (given his obvious talent) I have seen in a good while.

Then second game after Polly had missed a hat full of simpler chances, but got his name on the score sheet with impressive control and assured finish from an incisive through ball. 2-0 at half time and confidence was flowing, although we had capitulated to the most ludicrous of home defeats against Indian Gym from almost exactly the same position earlier in the season so a big second half performance was needed.

Total domination from Guildford followed in the second half as they muscled Reading out of almost any possession of the ball, and used their subs to good effect against tired and increasingly disinterested Reading players. The game was sewn up with a lovely goal from Kit Fantastic, sealing his place as top scorer for the season. Employing a smart turn that left his marker for dead, he bore down on goal and classily lifted the ball over the on-rushing keeper with consummate ease. It looked bloody outstanding from the back.
