

# Guildford 2 – 2 Birmingham University (C Boot, M Rippon)

Both teams were approaching this game with the belief they could keep the pressure on Bath at the top of the table if they kept chalking up wins. Guildford had plenty to put right from the performance against Bournville the week before and Birmingham had also made a slow start to the second half of the season. The game started at a good tempo with Guildford having some nice spells of possession and creating a couple of chances before Birmingham Uni opened the scoring with a nice move of their own, several passes down the left had side concluded with Tom Merchant shooting low into the bottom right hand corner just passed an unsighted Simon Mason. Guildford picked themselves up quite quickly and leveled the match just six minutes later through recognised goal scoring combo Ali Falconer and Chris Boot, this week's episode of goalscoring techniques came from a free hit that Falconer crucified towards the front post safe in the knowledge that Boot would do his best to convert, he got across the front of his marker and tipped in a diving deflection that just crept inside the back post. Following the goal the game was quite tight, Birmingham forced a couple of corners but good running from Henn and Falconer ran these down. At half time the score was locked at 1-1.

The second half could not have started any better for Guildford. Introducing Mercian sponsored Mike Rippon who has not been on the score sheet for a while, 1 minute into the second half he received a ball from DMarsh after a turnover near the Birmingham D, unfazed by his track record from this distance Rippon slotted home a wonder goal into the bottom left hand corner to send Guildford into a 2-1 lead. Good work captain.

Guildford had a few chances for break away goals in quick succession and could have given themselves a more comfortable lead, but Birmingham slowly began to dominate possession and move the ball around quite nicely. Guildford defended their lead well and restricted Birmingham to very few opportunities none of which were clear cut, Mason making a few routing saves, that was until the last minute when the ball was forced into the Guildford D from the top right side of the D, Mace was out quickly to prevent a decent shot but the Birmingham forward managed to dig out a rebound that just cleared the goalie.

Maybe a fair result based on Birmingham's possession in the second half, Guildford still came off disappointed with not killing off the games with a couple of goals after half time. Boot was happy to be on the score sheet again and after the game afforded us a quote "Of course I was happy with the goal but at the end of the day the result for the team is far more important. The boys are pleased that the performance has improved from last week and we are fortunate to have a game tomorrow so we can look to put a few more things right".

Guildford secured their 2nd victory of the New Year at the expense of Cheltenham with goals from Mike Rippon and Jonny the hit man Haynes.
